Vision

2012 Highlights

2012 marked significant celebrations at Easter Seals Alberta. Three Albertans in our Easter Seals family received the Queen Elizabeth II Diamond Jubilee Medal. Heather Harrison, Dale Briske and Kevin Karius were honoured for their contributions to building a caring society and country. The Camp redevelopment program achieved its first major goal – raising funds for the first new dormitory.

Programs & Services

The Easter Seals Equipment and Support Services Program (ESS) was busier than ever providing clients with mobility equipment. Our numbers continue to reflect an increasing need.

ESS provided:

- 214 pieces at a cost of \$471,579, including
- 114 pieces refurbished at a cost of \$55,438 resulting in a cost savings of \$363.542.

Drop Zone Results

Calgary Drop Zone once again captured top national spot – both for top fundraiser and total dollars raised over \$320K. A total of 171 Alberta rappellers raised a grand total of \$447,455, making us the largest provincial fundraiser in Canada. Alberta's Brien Perry was Canada's top fundraiser – bringing in \$36,038.00. Edmonton Drop Zone's highest fundraiser Dennis Davis raised \$7,316. Special thanks to WorleyParsons – Daredevil Diamond Sponsor for the Edmonton event.

Drop Zone 2012 also introduced Murray Todd as Honorary Chair. As top fundraiser in 2011, his involvement encouraged participation, connected us with sponsors and helped raise the event's profile.

Safeway Campaign

The Canada Safeway campaign enjoyed another landmark year, raising 1.2 million nationally and over \$405,000 in Alberta. The Easter Seals Celebrity Easter Bonnet decorating event – in partnership with Canada Safeway – brought local celebrities together to compete for best bonnet bragging rights. CTV's Darrel Janz led the creative action as Master of Ceremonies.

Speakers in School

This program – led by Barry Lindeman and Mark Ross – shared stories of disability due to spinal cord injuries to 1670 students at 28 schools. Staying in school, handling adversity and interacting with people with disabilities was also discussed.

Give a Kid A Lift

The Give a Kid a Lift program enjoyed greater profile and success in 2012, as a more complicated lift install was provided for one lucky Calgary recipient.

McQueen Residence

Easter Seals McOueen Residence had two residents move on and two new residents move in. The fall found past residents and staff sharing stories and reminiscing at a reunion held on site.

Easter Seals Camp Horizon

Over 1200 campers with disabilities and special needs participated in programs – from summer action to the magic of Christmas camp. The leadership program at Camp was revamped through another generous donation by Len and Phyllis Shapiro. The creation of L.E.A.D. & L.E.A.P. provided 18 young adults the opportunity to grow their leadership skills and self-confidence. KanAdventure was also launched, allowing 18 adult campers a week to experience an increased level of exploration and adventure.

Three grade six students raised and donated nearly \$30,000 to Camp through the Destination Imagination school initiative. The money went towards the Camp rafting program and camper subsidies.

The Build New Horizon's campaign to revitalize Easter Seals Camp Horizon has been tremendously successful, adding **two** million dollar partners to the project:

- The Calgary Home Builders Foundation
- The Province of Alberta

These donations prompted completion of designs and plans for the first two dorms. Construction begins this spring for the first dorm, with fundraising focused on raising the additional million dollars needed for the second dorm.
