2013 Highlights – CEO Message

2013 has been a year of resounding success and constant challenge. Ground was broken at our camp on the first Dormitory of the redevelopment. Many Albertans with disabilities were served with equipment and residential services. High school students learned more about living with disabilities and overcoming adversity through our speakers programs. Great new partnerships were forged, new events, new relationships, and successful high quality and essential programming was provided. Alberta, however, in particular the southern portion, faced a major flood and the landscape of our environment was changed – both physically and philanthropically in a heart beat. In spite of this, Easter Seals Alberta, its donors, leaders, volunteers, staff, and clientele are determined to continue to strive to make a difference in people's lives and to rebuild events and programs that were impacted, in this coming year and beyond. We are grateful to all who support our work and are looking forward to a renewed energy and growth in 2014!

Program Highlights

The Easter Seals Equipment and Support Services Program (ESS) is a core service of the organization providing individuals of all ages with vital equipment needed to enhance mobility and provide independence and community integration. In 2013 we were able to provide 207 pieces of equipment including power scooters, power wheelchairs, home and driving adaptations at a cost of \$440,357. 83 of those items were recycled at a cost of \$33,908 resulting in a cost savings of \$443,000.

Give a Kid a Lift Program entered its third year. 21 year old Matthew was provided with an elevator in his home in the spring – prior to that he was confined to his upper level bedroom after an accident resulted in a Spinal Cord Injury in 2011. This gift, generously supported by the following community partners, has opened his world again.

McQueen Residence

The Easter Seals McQueen Residence has been home to nine adults with physical disabilities since 1975. The physical structure of the home itself needs some upgrades as it approaches its 40th birthday for which a professional engineering evaluation has been undertaken. This past year some of the residents' rooms needed extra insulation and weatherproofing; projects which have since been completed.



Easter Seals Camp Horizon

2013 was a year of growth, change, and challenge. In addition to the new redevelopment and new dorm, growth came through the exceptional donations of a new storage facility from Horizon North Inc., two brand new yurts and a fleet of mountain bikes from ATB Financial and specialized adaptive bikes from the Avril Lavigne Foundation. All of these additions helped us to create memorable camp experiences for the +1200 youth and adults with disabilities and special needs who shared some time with us this year.

Change came with the departure of some seasoned staff who had been with Camp for many, many years and the new faces at Camp which have quickly proven to be wonderful additions to our team. Changes to the provincial and federal student grant programs, as well as the dynamics of the Alberta labour market, present a challenge as we continue to work to attract the highest quality staff to be a part of our team.

The June flood challenged Camp in many ways. Getting the chance to practice our evacuation procedures twice proved that our staff training and annual policy/procedure reviews have truly paid off. Our annual 'The Banded Peak Challenge' event scrambled to find a new summit and was rewarded with generous participants, volunteers, and supporters once again.

Phyllis Davidson Scholarship Program

Since its establishment in 2006, 18 students have been afforded post secondary education through the generous annual contribution of the Davidson family. Currently five students with disabilities are attending programs including education, psychology, engineering, and political science.
